

# Supporters gather to tout voter-verified ballots

At Sunday's benefit for the Coalition for Voting Integrity, Lori Rosolowsky used ATM machines to illustrate the process she and other volunteers are promoting.

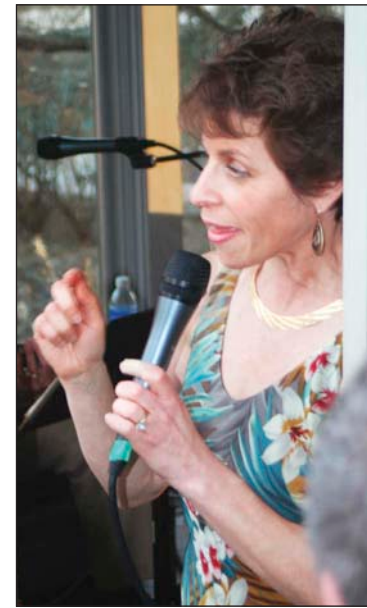
The cash machines provide proof of correctness for the bank through receipts. "In the voting process we need an equally provable but different method since by law elections cannot give out receipts," she said. "So we are not asking for a receipt for our votes. The proof of the vote can be provided in the optical scanner's voter marked paper ballots, which are software independent."

The party, complete with music by the Wilverines, was held at the Doylestown home of Chris and Maureen Serpico to raise awareness and gain financial support and good will for the use of optical scanners in the balloting.

The nonpartisan coalition has advocated for such a voting system in Bucks County while the county commissioners have said that such computer independent proof was not needed. The touch screen machines now in use were purchased to replace mechanical voting machines after vote counts were questioned nationwide.

Ruth Matheny, co-founder of the nonpartisan group, asked state Sen. Chuck McIlhinney, Congressman Patrick Murphy and local Democrats' Associate Chair Neil Samuels to partner with CVI to promote publicly and legislatively the need for software independent voter marked paper ballots.
